Principals Report



Dear Parents,

I want to express my thanks to those who worked tirelessly in the lead up to the Wheelbarrow Race and also on the night. It was an opportunity for the P and F to raise money for the students and the school and it is very much appreciated. To be able to put together a beautiful meal and feed

nearly 500 people in just over an hour is a testament to everyone pulling together to get the job done. With another big event this weekend with the Lions Festival, could I ask that you find the time to help out the P and F for an hour or so and spread the work load to help out with the coffee and cake stall. This week Rachelle and I have spent three days in Sydney learning about the teachings of Mary Mackillop and Julian Tenison Woods. As a school that has been established by the Josephite Sisters it is important to recognise their influence on our school. Dear Parents/Carers,

This week, Kath and I headed to Sydney where we attended the Josephite Colloquium held at the Mary MacKillop house. Here we were given the opportunity to develop personally and spiritually and were able to articulate and emulate the spirit and charism of Mary MacKillop and

the Sisters of St Joseph. The aim of attending this most uplifting experience was for us to come back to our school community and share with you what makes us the special school we actually are. A Josephite school whom shares in and continues the amazing work of the first Australian Saint – Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop: helping those who are less fortunate, having courage to face difficult situations, leading a life of faith, showing and having respect for all those who surround us, trusting in what God has in store for us, being humble, displaying utmost integrity and having hope for what lies ahead, just to name a few.

I would also like to take this opportunity to discuss with you the meaning of our School's Josephite Emblem. The emblem was very special to Mary MacKillop and Fr Julian Tension Woods and reminds the Sisters of St Joseph of the importance of Jesus, Mary, Joseph and John the Baptist in their lives. The Cross is a symbol of the



religious name Mary called herself – 'Mary of the Cross', when she became Sister of St Joseph. It also signifies that she was called on to bear the cross many times throughout her life. The A and M (drawn over the top of each other), stands for Ave Maria (Hail Mary) and is a symbol for Mary, mother of Jesus. The three J's are for Jesus - the one to whom Mary gave her life, Joseph – whom Mary prayer to often and most fervently and John the Baptist – who prepared the way for Jesus and as Mary MacKillop wanted to do as well.

Thank you to all those who were able to attend our year 3/4 hosted Mass and year 5/6 Anointing Mass. The children loved having you there and we hope you are able to join the prep/1/2 class when they host their Mass on Wednesday 14th June at 9:00am.

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Influenza Vaccination and Prevention Measures

The Queensland Department of Health has issued a request to disseminate information to schools so that staff and parents/ guardians are informed, prepared and proactive as we enter the influenza season. The Department of Health advises:

With the influenza season just around the corner it is an opportune time to actively encourage influenza vaccination. This year the vaccine covers two strains of Influenza A and two strains of Influenza B. The inclusion of a second Influenza B strain provides additional protection for staff, students and the school community as it is Influenza B that particularly affects younger age groups.

As you are aware, the sustained and close learning environment and boarding accommodation (when applicable) in schools increases the likelihood of infections spreading. We know that once influenza has been introduced to a school it spreads easily and can result in a significant number of affected students and staff. Increased awareness and ongoing attention to prevention and control measures, such as vaccination and good hygiene, are steps that we can all promote to reduce the impact of influenza.

Queensland Health is encouraging staff and students to be vaccinated for influenza as well as promoting other prevention and control measures, such as using tissues for coughs and sneezes and handwashing.
