Principals Report



Dear Parents,

Welcome back to the school year. I am pleased to see that all our students have settled into the daily school routines comfortably. As a school staff at St Anthony's, we are continually striving to look at our current practices within the school and ensure we are meeting the

needs of our students and the school community. Part of that process is to listen and then problem solve how we can best meet those needs while staying within the guidelines of Catholic Education Services. After discussions with key stakeholders and working through solutions we have endeavoured to bring about a few changes this year to hopefully make everyone's lives a little easier.

You will notice our newsletter is now published monthly and will be a collection of general information as well as celebrations and awards. We realise that accessing the newsletter can be time consuming for parents especially if you are simply wanting to know a time and place for an event. To make it simpler we are now publishing a Weekly Bulletin as a one page paper copy sent home on a Friday to put in a convenient place each week as a reminder of up and coming events for the following week. We trust this has been useful. At the beginning of each term we will continue to send home an overview of each term as a Calendar but please be aware that sometimes setting dates in advance means that there may be changes. We will communicate these changes through parent email as well as the Weekly Bulletin. This hopefully will eliminate any confusion with dates and times.

Each year we survey the staff using the dimensions of the School Effectiveness Framework and use this information to set goals for the new school year.



School Effectiveness Framework

This is an important document within Catholic Education in the Diocese of Cairns. The purpose of the School Effectiveness Framework process is grounded in research that principals are second only to teachers, in their impact on student wellbeing and learning. The work of Fullan,

Hattie, Leithwood, Robinson amongst others, highlights strong effective leadership from all staff as fundamental in moving schools towards improvement and transformation. Schools make a lasting difference when they focus on specific and explicit, evidence based goals for improvement and make decisions about how and when these goals will be monitored and achieved. Schools improve the wellbeing and learning for all students by enhancing the way curriculum is delivered, focusing on effective pedagogical practices for all students, creating a culture that promotes learning and by increasing parent engagement in their child's learning at home and at school through productive school community partnerships. These are the basis of our 2018 goals at St Anthony's School as we continue to work towards constant and continual school improvement.

Our school goals this year are to focus on improving student literacy outcomes through changes in classroom practice based on analysis of student data. From teacher and student reports our students are enjoying the new way in which we approach our Literacy Block in the mornings with a big focus this year on reading, writing and spelling using new programs and approaches.

Our second goal is to increase awareness in students, staff and parents of our school Charism and continue to maintain and build on the traditions that make us St Anthony's School. Our patron is St Anthony and our school was founded by the Josephite Sisters. It is important that we understand the history of the school and continue to teach the traditions that make St Anthony's School unique in its setting in Dimbulah.

School - Community Partnerships

Our staff value the continued support of parents who make the commitment to assist at our school events and our students appreciate knowing that they are part of a larger family who take care of each other. We would like to say thank you for the support at recent events such as Working Bee, Whole School Opening Mass, P and F AGM, Swimming and Reading. Modelling to our students positive community involvement will only strengthen their knowledge and understanding that a community can only function if the people who live in it "step up" and take an active role. One day it will be their turn to be the adults supporting their own children in a community and will hopefully remember the African proverb,
