

## PARENTING BEYOND VIOLENCE

A group for women who've experienced domestic violence, who may or may not have children currently in their care.

Parenting Beyond Violence (PBV) explores the dynamics of domestic violence and the impact it may have on women and their children, focusing on how domestic violence influences parenting. This group openly discusses:

- \* The context and impacts of domestic and family violence
- \* Myths linked to domestic violence
- \* Importance of safety and support
- \* Parenting challenges
- \* Engaging effectively with systems



## Moon Buggy Launch

Sixteen very proud space technologists tested their moon buggy prototypes on a simulated moon surface at our school on Thursday, 4<sup>th</sup> June.

Very special guest, Dr Zane Hatfield, world renowned space technologist from NASA headquarters, Washington, tested whether the buggies complied with some very strict criteria.


After testing their moon buggies, each technologist attended a press conference where they appraised their buggy and made suggestions for improvements.

Mr Hatfield said that he was impressed with the standard of the prototypes and agreed with the test findings that an effective moon buggy should have at least four big wheels that turn well, a well attached, sealed container and that the string should be tied so that it doesn't detach from the buggy.

The small crowd present at the testing cheered loudly when each buggy made it through the testing process. Special thanks to Greg, our assistant technician who helped with technical support in the lead up to the event and to 'Ruth' and all other helpers on the day. Well done to all 16 very talented space technologists!

- Poppers and soft drinks are available at club prices for purchase and \$2 sausage sizzle inside the clubhouse.



Alcohol is to be consumed outside the clubhouse in the bar area.
