Since our last newsletter, we have been involved in several activities in which the children have witnessed, celebrated and enjoyed.

Shrove Tuesday

The word "Shrove" is the past tense of "Shrive." Shrive means to hear confession of, assign penance to, and absolve.

Lent is a time of abstinence - traditionally of meat, fat, eggs and dairy products.

The English custom of making pancakes is one way to use up fat, eggs and dairy products. Hence, this is how Shrove Tuesday came to be sometimes called "Pancake Day." Traditionally the pancakes were served with lemon juice and sugar.

Our Traditional "Pancake Feast" on Shrove Tuesday was another huge success and hit. Ash Wednesday

We gathered as a school community to celebrate the beginning of Lent with our Ash Wednesday Mass. Our school community and parishioners were marked with ashes in the form of a cross on their forehead as a reminder that we are turning away from things we are not proud of and following in Jesus' ways.

As I mentioned in our last newsletter, Lent is a special time for us to get ready for Easter. It begins with Ash Wednesday and concludes on Easter Sunday when we remember Jesus rising from the dead.

From time to time we refocus on our relationship with Jesus Christ. Lent is one of those times. Sometimes we might 'give something up' for Lent. But it can also be a time to 'add something on'. Over the centuries three activities have been practiced as ways to refocus on our faith lives: prayer, giving to the poor and fasting.





Project Compassion

and indefinite articles (i.e. il, la, un, una) This is usually very difficult for English speakers to grasp so to all of my students - Bravo!!

We have also introduced a very popular activity for all of the students. To improve their speaking ability, the children have been role playing in our 'Salone da Parrucchiere' - our hairdressing salon. Have you ever noticed the dialogue between a hairdresser and a customer? The hairdresser will, of course, greet the customer and usually ask them lots of questions about themselves.
